NC eProcurement 2020 Upgrade News - July 1 Go Live Is Coming Soon!

On July 1, the NC eProcurement Upgrade will go live and be available for all users! Following the launch of the new NC eProcurement system, users will have access to both the **existing Version 9R1**, as well as the **upgraded Version AOD** of NC eProcurement. The <u>NC eProcurement website</u> will display links to both versions of the system, and a Go-Live announcement with links to both versions will be sent.

NC eProcurement 2020 Upgrade News - Creation of Requisitions Goes on Hold on June 24

To prepare for the Go-Live of the new system on July 1, on June 24 NC eProcurement will **remove the ability to create new requisitions** in the current NCEP Version 9R1 system. Starting June 24, you will no longer be able to select the **'Create eRequisition'** button or copy existing eRequisitions in the current system.

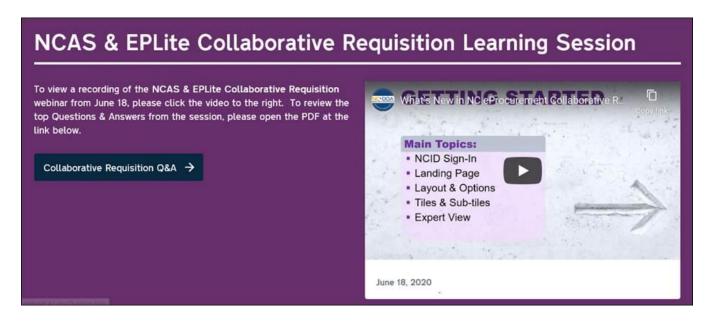
From June 24-30, approve all submitted requisitions. Please remember that during this period you do retain the ability to **submit** requisitions in composing status, **approve** submitted requisitions, **change** orders, **cancel** orders, and **receive** orders.

Following Go-Live on July 1, create all new requisitions in the new Version AOD of NC eProcurement.
