

Multi Year Indicator

The **multi year indicator** (MYI) field allows funds to be allocated in future fiscal years. As a reminder, the MYI cannot be updated on change orders. However, other changes, such as adding lines or editing prices, can be made. The **MYI** can be updated on the line items added with a change order before submitting the change order. Users should not select **no choice** or **previous fiscal year XX** from the dropdown as this will cause an error.


eVP Award Update

For eVP Agency Application users who post solicitations in NC eProcurement Sourcing, an **NCEP contract workspace ID** field will now be listed on the award in eVP. This is a required free-text field that was implemented to ensure that a contract workspace is created before the contract is awarded. The user must enter the associated contract workspace number. Requisition Print View Update

The requisition print view in NC eProcurement now includes an **agency management unit** field. To see the print view of a requisition, pull up a requisition in **expert view** and select the **print** button.
